Dr Maiga is member of the Technical Working Group 4 of the CAADP Biennial Review on Enhancing Agriculture's Contribution to Economic Growth and Significant Poverty Reduction, and the Lead of the Gender Technical Working Group of CAADP-XP4, a continental project on Climate Smart Agriculture, with implementing institutions as FARA, ASARECA, AFAAS, CCARDESA, and CORAF.
